FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

When do I have to join?

There's no pressure to join. Visit us anytime, as often as you like.

How do I join?

How much do I have to pay to join?

Toastmasters is a not-for-profit organisation, this means the cost to join is very low. There is a one-off payment to Toastmasters International upon joining, and a semi-annual fee payable twice a year by the 1st April and 1st October, pro-rata if you don't join in these months. ([See the table below](#) for the amount you would pay, depending on the month you join.)

What do I receive if I join?

Once you become a member of Berowra Toastmasters you will receive:

- You will gain access to our comprehensive online learning materials in Pathways – this [video](#) provides a short overview.
- Berowra Toastmasters has an exclusive 'Buddy Program' designed to help new members settle in. You will be assigned an experienced 'Buddy'.

What do I have to bring to the meetings?

As a guest, you are not required to bring anything. However, you may want to make some notes so we recommend bringing some notepaper and a pen.

What do the various Agenda roles mean?

Members of our Club take it in turns to perform each role on the agenda. That way, everyone has a chance to continually take on new challenges.

Chairman: The Chairman's job is to run the meeting from start to finish. They prepare the agenda before the meeting and introduce each role.

Guest Welcome: By the time you read this, the person handling this role should have already introduced themselves. It is their responsibility to speak to guests before the meeting and to introduce you to the rest of the group and tell them what inspired you to visit Toastmasters.

Grammarian: This position is all about listening to language throughout the meeting and pointing out especially wonderful words or phrases in a report. To get us all thinking about language, the Grammarian also presents a "Word for the Night", which everyone is encouraged to use and in doing so, expand our vocabulary.

Mission: At every meeting we are reminded of the Toastmasters mission, to ensure that we are keeping club standards high and to remind us of the importance of what we do in our club.

Surprise: This short assignment provides the opportunity to be creative – you may recite a poem, tell a story, anything really!

Table Topics: This part of the meeting gets everyone to "think on their feet". Topics are presented at random and people chosen to speak for one minute without any preparation time. You never know what might happen in this part of the meeting, but you do know it will be exciting!

Toastmaster: In the second half of the meeting, there are a series of prepared speeches. It is the Toastmaster's job to introduce both the speakers and their evaluators.

Timer: The Timer reminds everyone throughout the meeting to keep to time (notice the lighting system & noise aids) and presents a report on individual times so that people can get used to speaking with a limit.

Evaluators: There are a number of evaluation roles on the agenda. Everyone who comes to Toastmasters is interested in improving, and one of the best ways to do that is to have another member objectively report on the strengths and weaknesses they see in others speaking. All evaluations are positive and recommendations for improvement are always outweighed by encouragement.

Speakers: The speakers are members who are working through projects in their communication manuals. For more information on the opportunities available to members, speak to a friendly member of our club.

TO JOIN OUR CLUB (Club 1879, District 90)

When you are ready to join our club you will need to complete the [Berowra Toastmasters Membership Application Form](#). The fees are also listed below. When completing this form:

- Complete all details on the front page and sign where required on the second page
- Please note that our club does not accept credit card payments, only bank transfers.

MEMBERSHIP FEES

There is a one-off joining fee of A\$75, plus A\$120 for each half-year, payable by the beginning of April and beginning of October (pro-rata). For example, to join in August would be A\$75 (one off) + A\$40 (eg pro rata for Aug and Sep), with another A\$120 due for the six months starting in October. Annual fees would be a maximum of A\$315 for the first year, and A\$240 for subsequent years. We believe this is excellent value for money.

You can use the below table to work out fees based on the month of joining. Example is you join any time in the month of July, the total fee would be A\$135:
